


new start/new faith Grant Program

It is the mission of the Nebraska United Methodist Foundation to be a catalyst that strengthens Nebraska ministries and churches. We support innovative ideas that meet the needs of a diverse and rapidly changing society. Part of the way in which we do this is through our New Start/New Faith community grants. In 2024, over \$45,000 was awarded in new start/new faith community grants.

In January 2023, Imperial UMC disaffiliated from the United Methodist Church. Those who desired to remain United Methodist began to make plans to start their own church. Five months later, **Faith UMC of Chase County** launched, and they are now approaching their second anniversary. Faith UMC of Chase County began providing church services with guest speakers and then formed a cooperative ministry with United Methodist churches in Palisade and Stratton, welcoming Pastor Jacob Keega. The New Start/New Faith grant from the Nebraska United Methodist Foundation helped to cover rent and to save for a down payment on a permanent location. Now just two years later, 2025 presents exciting opportunities for Faith UMC of Chase County as they will be moving from the rented conference room in the Natural Resources District building to a dedicated church building.

Making An Impact In Nebraska

FIRST CHURCH OF NORTH PLATTE Brady UMC

Gibbon Free Pantry

During the spring of 2023, Pastor Mike Evans of First United Methodist Church of North Platte approached the district superintendent to see if there was a church that they could help. At that time, Brady UMC was in need of a pastor, but unable to financially support one.

So, Brady UMC and First United Methodist Church of North Platte came up with a creative arrangement: Using ministry grant funds from the Nebraska United Methodist Foundation, Brady UMC upgraded their sound system so they could begin live-streaming Pastor Mike's sermons for their congregation.

What began as a smart business decision quickly developed into a friendship. "Brady UMC has grown in this agreement," said Julie Hoagland. "The laity have been forced to step up and get out of our comfort zone. We are volunteer-led. We have people that take care of the technology each week, facilitate the service, take communion to those not in attendance, take care of the building and grounds, fill out the paperwork, and many other things. Our congregation has taken ownership of our church. Many ask why this arrangement works. It works because we want it to work. Both parties want it to work."

Faith United Methodist Church began operating the Gibbon Free Pantry in 2018 as a service to their community. It's run exclusively by volunteers who've created a welcoming space for patrons. As a free-choice pantry, it's set up much like a grocery store, allowing each person to move through the space selecting items that work best for them and their families.

The pantry receives food donations from local and regional outlets as well as community food drives. Grant funds from the Nebraska United Methodist Foundation supplement current donations to ensure that each family has access to milk and eggs.

"We have several families with multiple generations under one roof. With 11 people in the home, a gallon of milk does not go very far. We make exceptions for the larger families so there is milk for the children. We hear from seniors that with living on a fixed income and the prices of everything on the rise, that the pantry is making a difference for them if they can eat or skip meals," said Kathy Pierce, Gibbon Free Pantry Co-Director.
